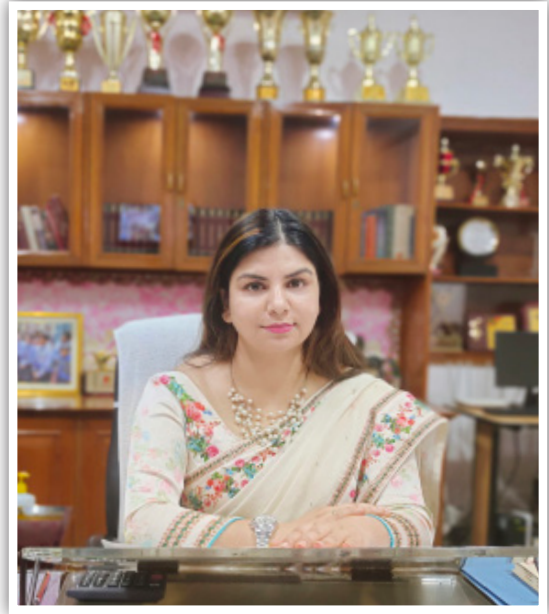

Students use Avishkaar's Pro, Advanced robotics kits and AVISHKAAR MAKER STUDIO (AMS) application software for programming in Robotics. Students burn the program in the AMS to make the working robots. Through the AVISHKAAR ROBOTICS KIT, They made different types of robots such as four wheeler, three wheeler, simple crane, crane with gear, gripper, soccer player, wind mill etc. Till now Students have four wheeler, three wheeler, simple crane, crane with gear in all the classes and Gripper model has started in some classes. यह एक ऐसी सीख है जो मैंने अपने जीवन में तब सीखी जब मैं एक छात्र था और कुछ ऐसी सीखी कि आज तक याद है। अब मैं इसे अपने जीवन का एक महत्वपूर्ण नियम बना चुका हूँ। बात सन 2003 की है। जब मैं कक्षा नौवीं में था। आधी छुट्टी के बाद पाँचवा कालांश (पीरियड) शुरू हो गया था। यह हमारा खेल का पीरियड था। हम सभी बच्चे अपने आपस में बातें कर रहे थे जिससे तेज कोलाहल की स्थिति पैदा हो रही गई। तभी खेल की शिक्षिका आई और दरवाजे से ही पूछा कि- क्या यह बातें करने का पीरियड है? और मैंने एकदम से हाँ में जवाब दे दिया। उसके बाद शिक्षिका बहुत क्रोधित हुई और पूछा कि किसने कहा? पर डर के कारण सभी बच्चे चुप रहे। हमारे इस व्यवहार से और क्रोधित होकर उन्होंने सभी बच्चों को अपने स्थान पर खड़े होकर, हाथ खड़े करने की सजा दी और सभी से पुनः पूछा कि अब भी बता दो किसने हाँ कहा। किसी भी बच्चे ने जवाब नहीं दिया और न ही मैंने डर के कारण कुछ कहा।

इससे शिक्षिका का क्रोध और अधिक बढ़ गया। उन्होंने एक-एक कर बच्चों की पिटाई शुरू कर दी। दो बच्चों को मेरी वजह से मार पड़ चुकी थी कि मैं बाहर आया और कहा कि- मैम, मैंने गलती से हाँ कह दिया था। मुझे लगा कि आपने पूछा है कि- ये खेल का पीरियड है? और मैंने हाँ कह दिया। उसके बाद मैम ने मेरे गाल पर दो चांटे लगाए। पर किस्मत को इतने से संतोष नहीं था। मैम की नजर मेरी कमिज पर गई। जिसमें स्कूल के नाम का लोगो नहीं लगा था। मैम ने कहा कि- लोगो कहाँ है? मैंने कहा कि नई कमिज है जिसके कारण अभी नहीं लगा पाया। इतना सुनते ही एक डंडा फिर से पड़ा। तब से मैंने कसम खा ली कि बिना ठीक से सुने कोई जवाब नहीं दूंगा, भले चुपचाप ही क्यों न रहना पड़े।
